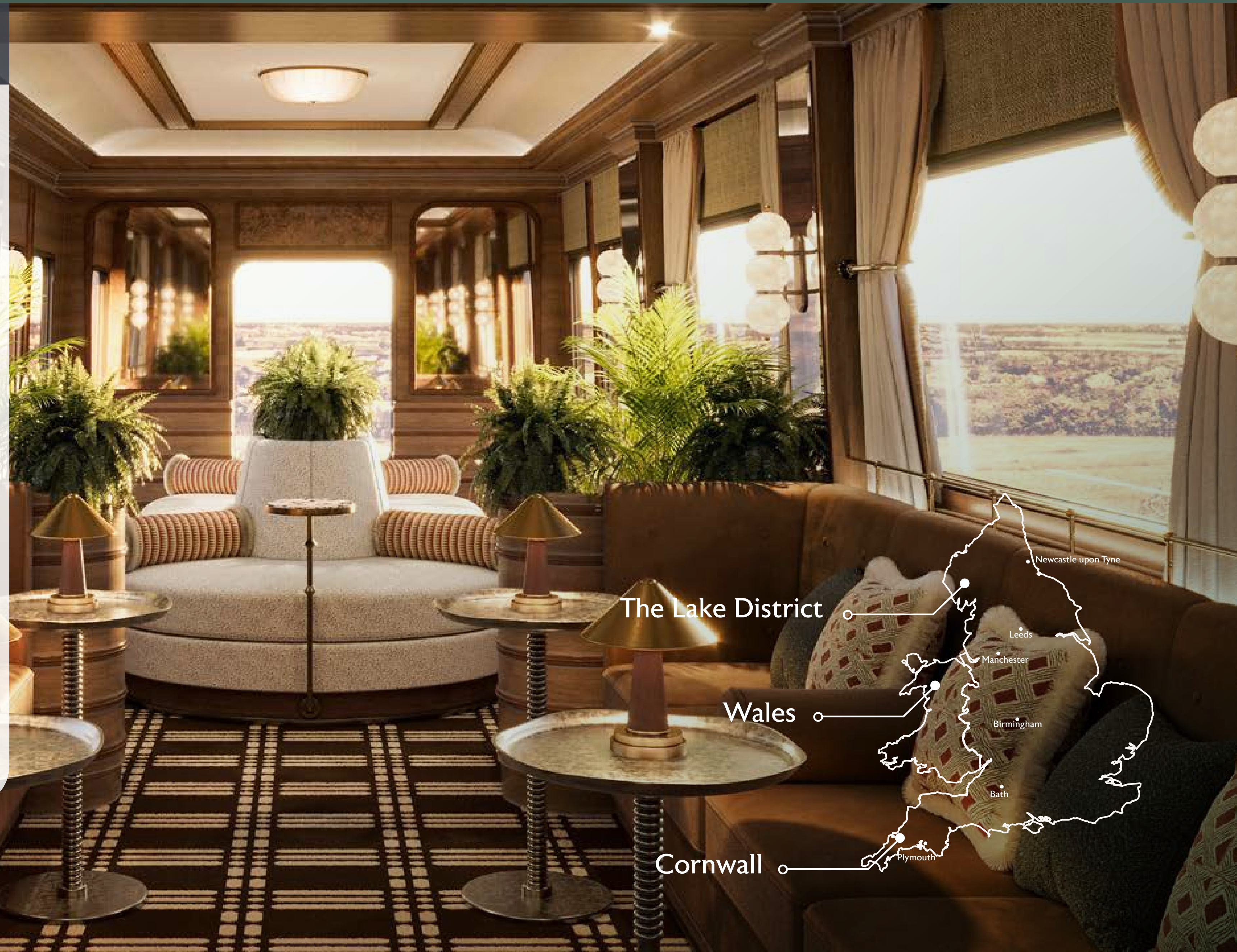

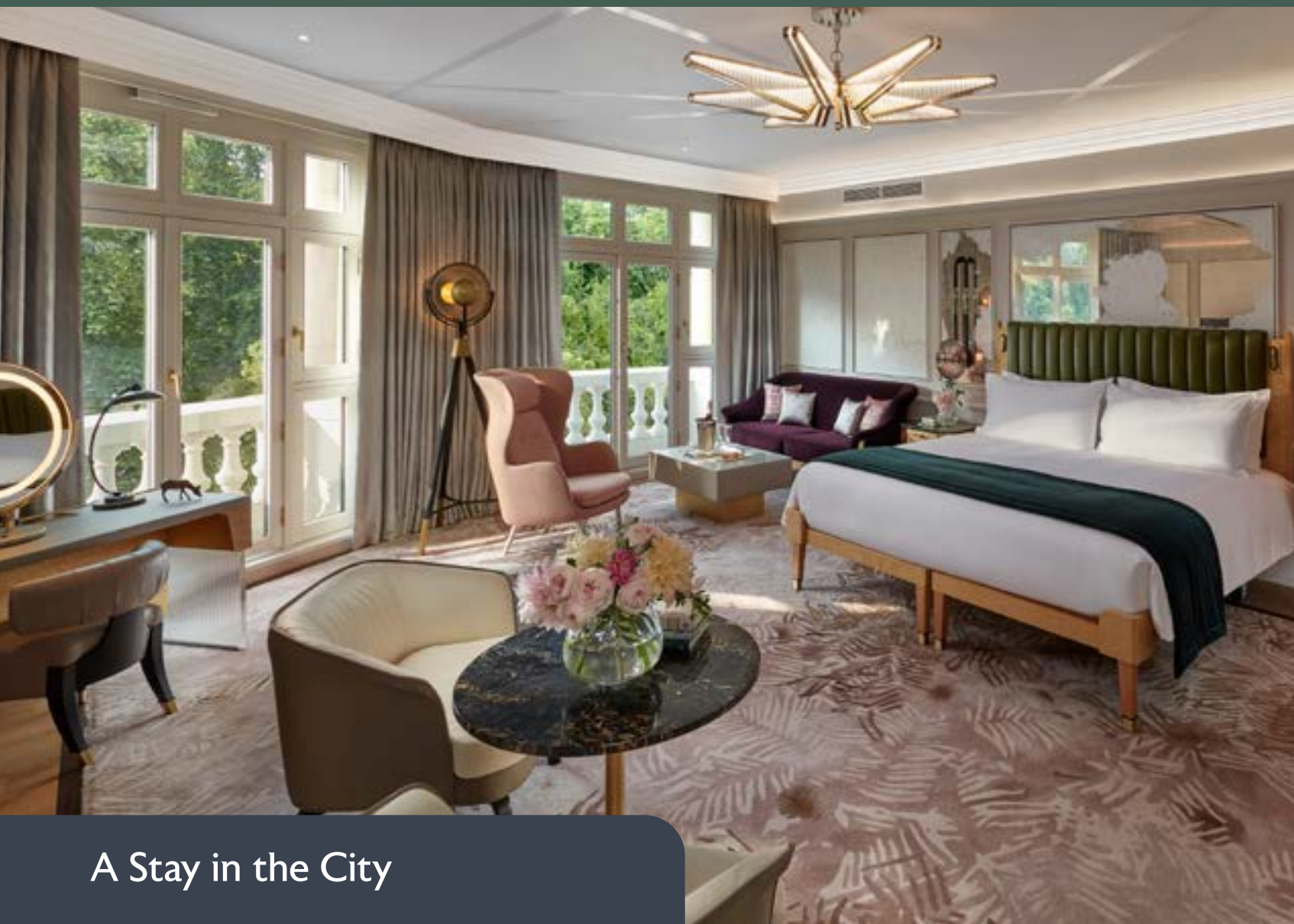

Broughton Hall is an impressive 16th century Georgian manor available for exclusive use.

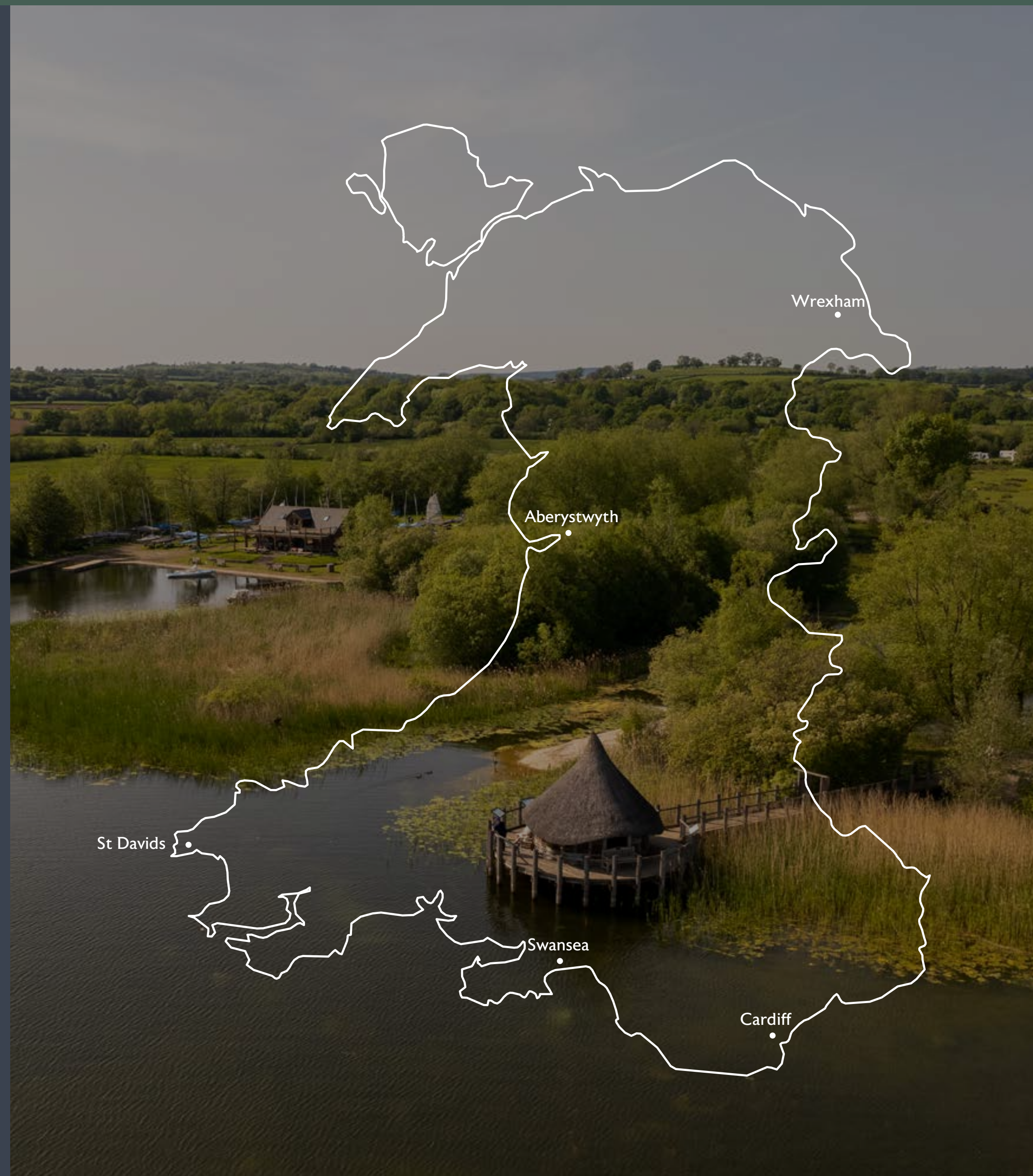

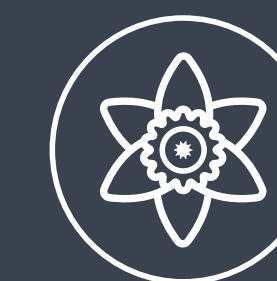

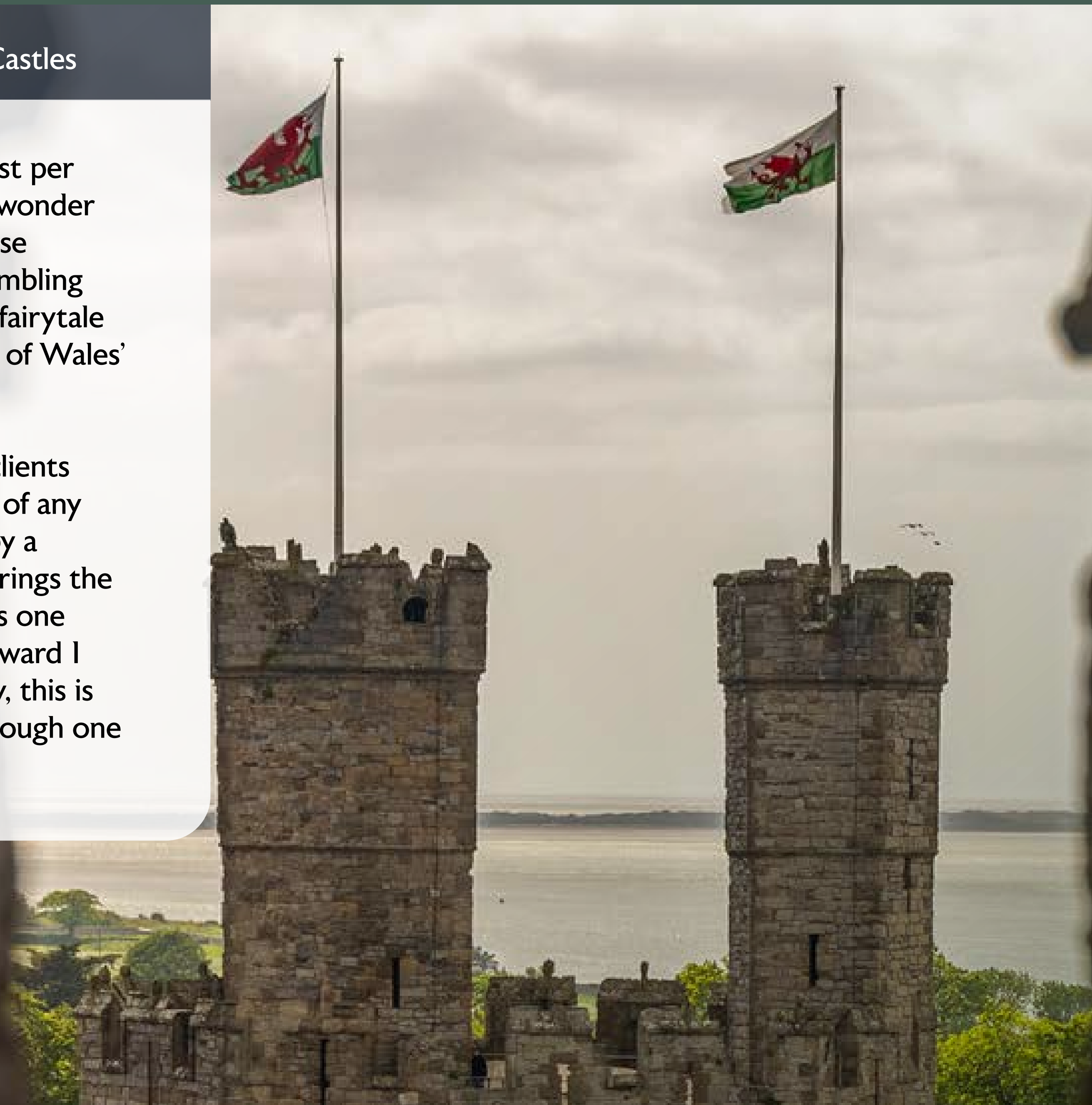

Guests can enjoy complimentary tours of the hotel's unique art collection, while Caerfai Bay and the city centre are within walking distance.

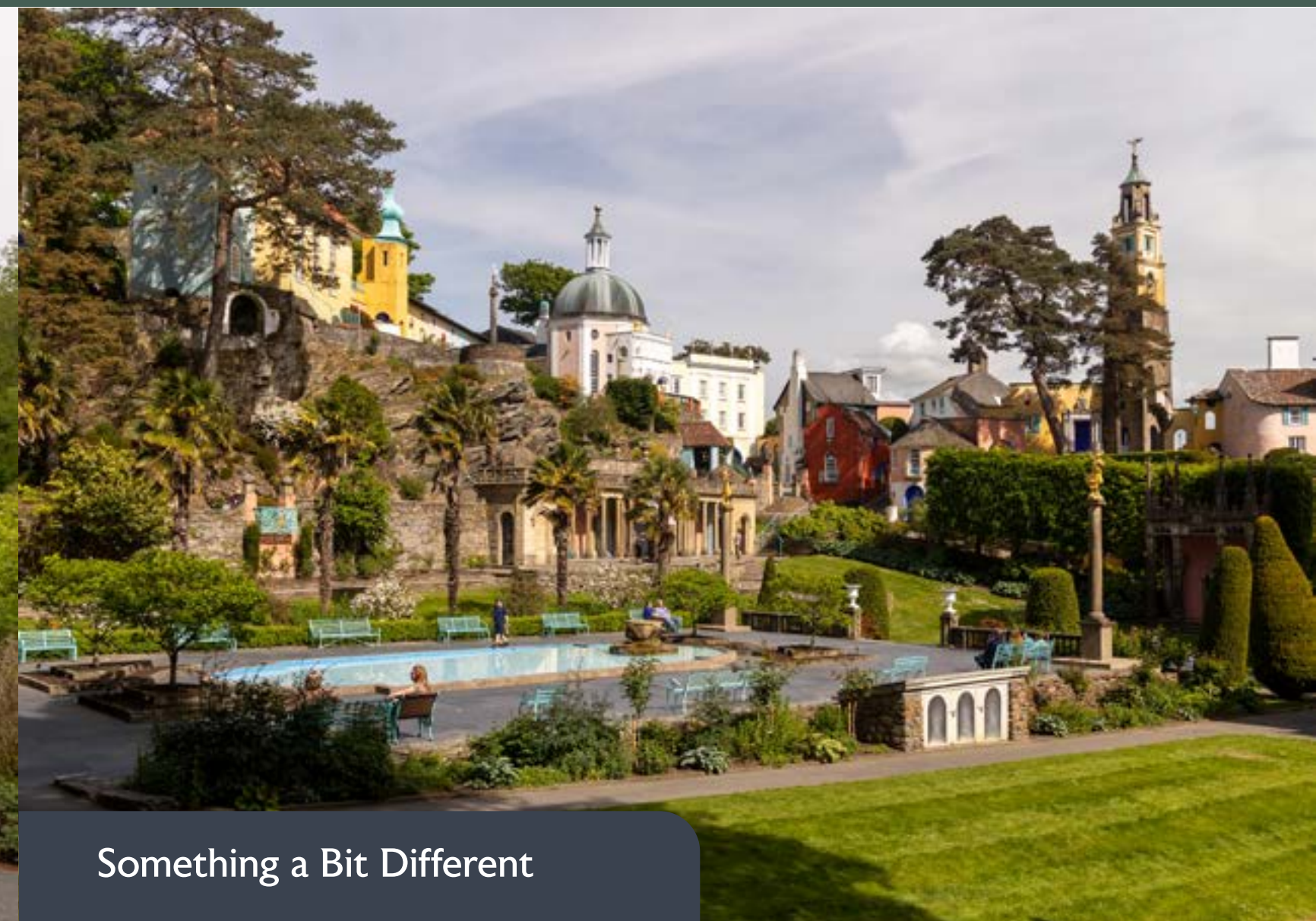


A Stay in the Countryside

Step into the stories of Ireland's capital

A guided walking tour of Dublin reveals the city's rich and complex past.

Exploring the rolling fields where pedigree Italian buffalo graze, they'll meet the herd up close before learning about the craft of cheesemaking in the farm's parlour, where rich buffalo milk is transformed into award-winning produce.

Along the way, your guests will gain unique insight into the traditions of Gaeltacht Mhúscraí, immersed in rural life, local culture, and the beauty of this hidden corner of southwest Ireland.



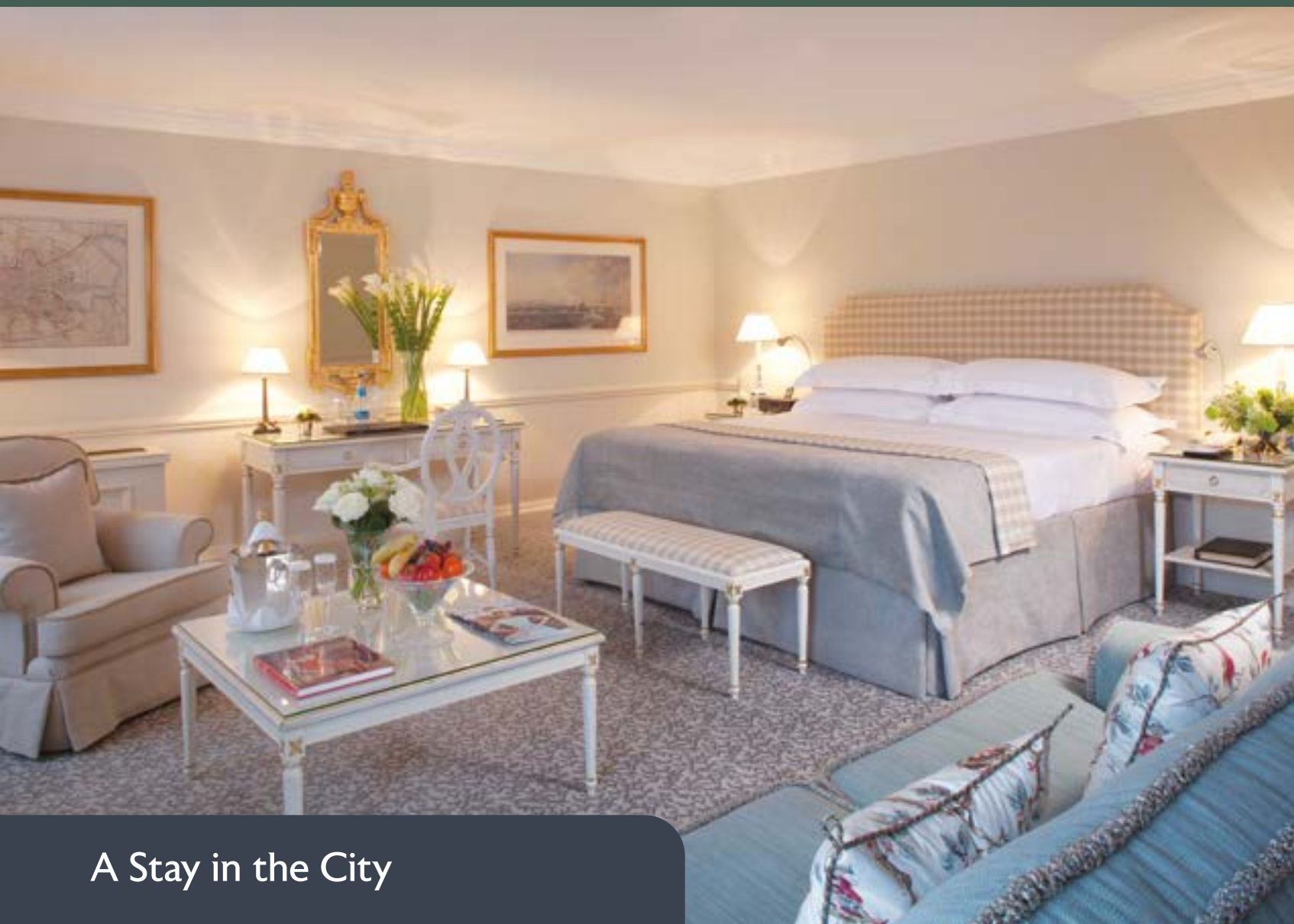
Get wild with expert seashore foraging
